But her world slowly changed after the Germans invaded Poland on September 1, 1939. Eventually, her family is forced into hiding when rumors of Jews being taken from their homes and sent to camps, or even worse being murdered, start to spread. This is the true story of two teens who lived in Nazi Europe during WW II and how they survived. Rudi Vrba was just a teen when the war started. As a Jew, he knew he wasn't safe, so he tried to escape from Slovakia but was captured and eventually sent to the Auschwitz concentration camp in Poland. Gerta Sidonova, a schoolmate of Rudi's, manages to escape with her family to Hungary, where she hides her Jewish identity. But it's becoming more difficult for them both to evade the Nazis. Rudi survives over two years in the camp and vows to escape so he can tell the world about the atrocities he witnessed. Meanwhile, Gerta and her mother are captured and sent to a camp in Hungary. In their own ways, they both manage to escape their horrible conditions and do their part to save thousands more from a terrible fate. (Grades 8 & up)
