In this heartbreaking and inspiring graphic novel, readers will meet Tsai Kun-lin, a boy living in 1930s Taiwan under Japanese occupation. Over the next few decades, he sees the defeat of Imperial Japan, the rise of the Chinese Communist Party, and eventually a civil war in China; each affecting him in profound ways. Thought to be a communist sympathizer, Kun-lin is eventually arrested for attending a book club at school and sent to a re-education camp. There he endures torture, hard labor, and isolation from his friends and family but finds a strength of mind and body that helps him endure. (Grades 7 & up)



ARTIFICE

Isa has been surrounded by art for her entire life. Her parents own an art gallery in Amsterdam, until it is confiscated by the Nazis during World War II. The Nazis take all the paintings, and the artists who used to hang out there are either forced into hiding or deported. When Isa's best friend Truus joins the Dutch resistance and needs money to help smuggle Jewish babies to safety, she thinks she knows how to help: by selling a Rembrandt forgery painted by her father. When Hitler is fooled by the copy, Isa thinks she can get Truus even more money by trying her hand at forging a Vermeer. Will her ploy work, or will the Nazis spot the fake? (Grades 7 & up)



THE HUNGER GAMES

The book takes place in North America, in a region called Panem. Each year 2 tributes from each district are chosen to fight in the Hunger Games. This year Katniss Everdeen and Peeta Mellark are selected for the 74th Hunger Games. Normally only one tribute can win, but this year after Katniss and Peeta create a star-crossed lovers storyline, the rules are changed to allow 2 tributes from the same district to win. This leaves the president of the Capitol feeling betrayed. Some of the districts also feel that Katniss is the face of the Revolution that the districts could possibly win.
