Brandon is separated from his dad in the chaos and struggles to escape. Reshmina is growing up in a small village in Afghanistan, where she wants to grow up to be a teacher and more than just someone's wife. On September 11, 2019, Reshmina comes across a U.S. soldier wounded by the Taliban and must decide if she should put herself and her family's lives at risk to save him. (Grades 6 & up)

He believes her lies and whisks her off to his castle, where she's forced to spin straw into golden chains. In the dungeon, she unknowingly summons a mysterious boy who offers to help her – for a price. Will Serilda be able to break the curse and free both herself and the boy from the king's wicked grasp?
