

This gets him kicked off as well, and he slowly sees his football future slip away. Some people in the town begin to demand police accountability, and Russell gets caught up in the protests. Themes of social justice and privilege, both racial and economic, are explored as Russell must weigh how far he is willing to go to support his former teammate. (Grades 9 & up)
