




#### GIRL ON THE FERRIS WHEEL

However, an undeniable connection to a boy she would have considered her polar opposite – punk band drummer Dmitri – has her clumsily falling in love for the first time. Depression and anxiety are not just things that go away, though, and Eliana must learn to deal with spiraling stress while not sabotaging their relationship. And though he wants to help, Dmitri must learn to simply be supportive while realizing he cannot "fix" Eliana. Can first love survive such differing personalities, even if they truly love each other? The play's plot begins when the Youngers receive an insurance check for \$10,000. Each adult member of the family has a different idea of what should be done with the money. The play progresses as each idea clashes and brings arguments between the family. Many obstacles such as betrayal and financial pressure try to bring the family down but they stick together and defer their dreams no longer.
