The final book in the Gibbs series allows the reader to follow Charlie, a 13-year-old genius, in her quest for hidden answers to some of history's greatest scientific questions. A step up in complexity from Gibbs' Space Case or Spy School books, Charlier Thorne introduces middle-grade readers to the spy thriller genre by crossing adventure, youth, and danger, while avoiding overtly mature or violent themes.
