

#### **ROAD HOME**

At the age of 17, Rex is kicked out of his house by his father because of his sexuality. Alone and with no idea where to go, Rex ends up in New Orleans at the home of a man he met on the beach. They begin a relationship that lasts a few weeks until something happens that forces Rex to leave. Now homeless and wandering the streets of New Orleans, he struggles each day to survive, always wondering if he could or should have taken a different path. This is a story of love, loss, depression, and ultimately joy and forgiveness. (Grades 9 & up)




#### WHEN WE BECOME OURS
