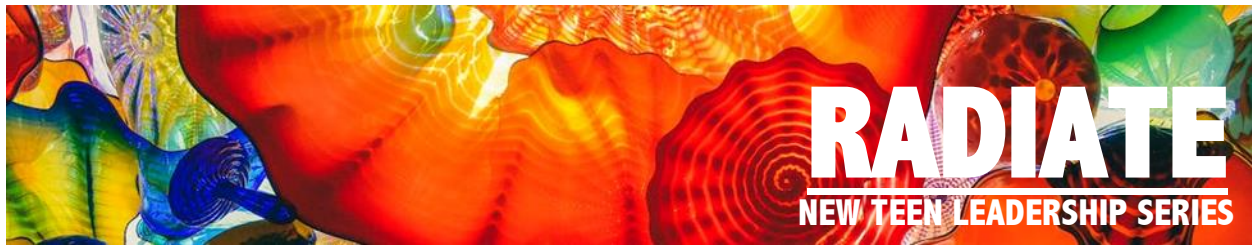

WHAT IS RADIATE?

Radiate is a new teen leadership program through Washington-Centerville Public Library that educates a small group of teens (Grades 9-12) about important topics that they or their peers may experience and how to deal with those experiences using professionally recommended skills and resources. The goal of this 5-session program is to train these teenagers to observe and assess unhealthy behaviors of their peers and intervene in a safe and responsible way, directing them to professional help to continue support if needed.
